Job Description

Are you an individual who is committed to breaking the cycle of power-based violence and abuse while supporting the Jewish community? JCADA is seeking a **Manager of Jewish Outreach and Partnerships** to further educate the broader local Jewish community about power-based violence and appropriate responses, and to provide resources for victims. Our holistic approach utilizes prevention and community education programs to create a gateway for victims and their friends and families to access our support services. JCADA is looking for an adaptable and perceptive person with demonstrated knowledge and experience working in an engagement position.

For 21 years, JCADA has served the Greater Washington, DC community by empowering survivors of domestic violence to live safely and educating youth about healthy relationships. Today, JCADA provides free counseling, legal and advocacy services to victims of domestic and intimate partner violence. JCADA runs a prevention initiative known as AWARE[®] that is dedicated to empowering a generation of young people with the skills and information they need to build healthy relationships. JCADA also provides high-quality trainings to community organizations, clergy and professionals on appropriate responses to victims of power-based violence.

Job Duties and Responsibilities:

Primary responsibilities will include, but are not limited to:

- Serve as an outreach liaison from JCADA to the Jewish community.
- Develop and implement a communication strategy to connect and engage with the Jewish community.
- Develop and implement outreach and partnership strategies to enhance Jewish community participation in services. In partnership with the Jewish Orthodox Feminist Alliance, (JOFA) design, recruit, and engage a well-rounded cadre of Project Ambassadors to include Jewish clergy and community leaders.
- Actively pursue engagement and outreach opportunities to solidify JCADA's presence in the Jewish community. Represent JCADA at relevant community events and programs as needed.
- Build and solidify partnerships with community leaders and related networks of professionals in the field of Jewish engagement, religious life, and education.
- Work collaboratively with JCADA leadership to ensure all JCADA outreach and communication is cohesive and complimentary.
- Work closely and collaboratively with JCADA's Prevention, Education and Training Manager to ensure all trainings, workshops, and education materials are consistent and optimized to achieve JCADA's goals. Manage the scheduling, facilitation, and evaluation of programming for the Jewish community with collaboration on curriculum development.

Preferred Experience:

- Master's and/or Graduate degree in Jewish communal service, public health, social work, criminal justice, gender studies, or a related field. May substitute a graduate level degree with high levels of training, facilitation, and coordination experience.



- Knowledge of the Greater Washington Jewish community.
- Knowledge or strong desire to learn public health approaches to prevention and education, victim services and power-based violence.
- Experience working with cross-cultural audiences.
- Excellent relationship building, verbal, written communication, and presentation skills.

- Excellent listener and communicator.
- Adaptability and ability to solve problems on the fly.
- Ability to handle stress as it relates to an organization that services victims of power-based violence.
- Ability to maintain and support a flexible schedule, evening and/or weekend hours are necessary.
- Commitment to professional and personal growth within the workspace.
- Flexible approach to time required to handle varying situations/problems.
- Commitment to operating in a trauma-informed, team-oriented, collaborative environment.

Salary: \$50,000 - \$55,000 plus benefits including short-term disability, long-term disability, life insurance, medical, dental, and vision insurance plan, SIMPLE Individual Retirement Account with match up to 3%, unlimited paid time off, and more.
